

## **Cookies**

Our site uses cookies. Cookies are text files containing small amounts of information which are downloaded to your personal computer, mobile or other device when you visit a website. Cookies are then sent back to the originating website on each subsequent visit, or to another website that recognises that cookie. Cookies are useful because they allow a website to recognise a user's device. Cookies in themselves do not identify you, just the computer or device you are using. Cookies do lots of different jobs, like making it easier for you to log on to and use our site during future visits, letting you navigate between pages efficiently, remembering your preferences, and generally improving the user experience. They also allow us to monitor traffic on our site.

Cookies themselves only record which areas of our site have been visited by your computer or device and for how long. Allowing us to create a cookie does not give us access to the rest of your computer.

Our partners, and information we include, may also include cookies. Examples of this may be for tracking analytics through Google Analytics, and for embedded Youtube videos. Other aspects of embedded content may include their own cookies.

With most Internet browsers, you can erase or block cookies or ask to receive a warning before a cookie is stored. The "Help" function within your browser should tell you how.
